History

The Augusta Symphony Guild was formed in 1957 as a women's organization to support the Augusta Civic Orchestra. Its purpose was to support the orchestra and all its activities, especially those of creating public interest in its concerts and establishing a permanent orchestra. After the first year, they assumed the responsibility for tickets sales and publicity for the orchestra.

As a "fundraising" effort, the Guild presented a "Waltz Night" on May 23rd, 1958. In 1963, the Guild expanded the idea of "Waltz Night" and held the first Cotillion at the Old Richmond Hotel.

As the 57th class of Augusta Symphony Guild Debutantes, you allow us to celebrate the defining role of the Augusta Symphony Orchestra in our community's cultural history and heritage and to continue the rich Southern tradition of presenting outstanding young women as Debutantes in our community.

What is a Debutante and a Cotillion Ball? There are many cotillions held every year in the U.S. Two of the most prestigious are the International Debutante Ball held in New York City and the National Debutante Cotillion and Thanksgiving Ball held in Washington, D.C.

Originally, a young woman made her debut when girls were deemed old enough to begin receiving romantic attention from young men, and when they could begin considering marriage proposals. A modern debutante is a young woman of college age interesting in upholding the tradition of making her entrance into adulthood. They raise money for charity, make valuable personal connections, and are actively involved in their communities. Debutantes enjoy parties, pageantry and fun with family and friends, as well as the glamour and sophistication of a ball.

Guidelines for Debutantes

The Debutante shall wear a long, all-white or candlelight formal gown with a ball skirt of width appropriate for a deep curtsy and formal white gloves. The dress should have **NO** contrasting color or embellishments (sequins, pearls, crystals, etc.) The hem of the dress should kiss the floor in the front and back. Dresses with trains will need to be bustled for the presentation.

Strapless and halter dresses are allowed however we ask that there be no plunging necklines. The back of the dress must come up to the waistline.

In order to avoid duplication of dresses, please call Emmie Ward, Dress Coordinator, (706-267-2623, emmieward@comcast.net) **BEFORE** purchasing a gown. Indee Few (706-294-5452, indeefew@comcast.net) will serve as a backup, should you be unable to reach Emmie. They will need the Designer's name, style number of the dress, and a picture of the front and back of your daughter in the dress. When you text the picture, please identify yourself in the text.

House of the Bride is one of our sponsors and they are happy to help you with a dress. Even if you find one out of town, you may want to check with them to see if they can order it for you. They also are happy to alter dresses bought from other stores. Please order the size dress that is measured for you—this may not match up to the size you wear in your everyday clothing. It is usually larger.

In years past, we have had some Debutantes who wished to wear dresses previously worn by their sisters and/or mothers that no longer met the guidelines set by the Augusta Symphony Guild Cotillion Committee. As a Committee, we understand and treasure the sentiments and traditions in wearing a gown that was worn by a sister or a mother. We have, therefore, agreed that if a Debutante wishes to wear a gown that was worn by a sister or mother at a previous **Augusta Symphony Guild Cotillion**, we will consider each dress on an individual basis.

All shoes must be close-toed, no embellishments, no mules, no boots or booties.

Please keep jewelry to a minimum: Single pearl studs or drop unless otherwise approved. Single strand pearl necklace unless otherwise approved. Single ear piercing only—all other ear piercings removed. No other body piercing.

All tattoos must be covered with makeup—including leg tattoos.

As an Augusta Symphony Guild Debutante, your behavior and actions reflect not only upon your family, but also on the Augusta Symphony Guild. Please conduct yourself appropriately with dignity and kindness.

Guidelines for Presenters and Escorts

All Presenters and Escorts are required to wear formal white tie attire rented through the designated vendor: Simon's Formal Wear.

Polished black shoes and black socks are required for Presenter and Escorts.

Formal dress uniforms of service academies may be considered for approval.

Debutante's escorts must be 18 years of age, or seniors in high school, to attend the Cotillion Ball. NO EXCEPTIONS. Escorts need to conform to our rules of dress and conduct.

Since the Cotillion occurs during a holiday weekend, it is often difficult for friends from college to attend. Experience has proven that it is best to invite family or close friends from our area to be escorts.

Attendance by the Presenter and two Escorts is MANDATORY at the Friday morning rehearsal. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Alcohol will not be served to anyone under the age of 21. The Marriott will not serve alcohol to anyone of any age without valid identification.

Guidelines for Debutante Families & Guests

Formal attire appropriate for a formal white-tie event is expected of family members and all guests. This includes long dresses for females and tuxedos for males.

It is the desire of the Augusta Symphony Guild that the Cotillion remain an adult affair. Therefore, the age requirement for the Debutante's escorts must be 18 years of age or seniors in high school to attend the Cotillion Ball. NO EXCEPTIONS. Debutante's siblings may attend the Cotillion Ball as guests provided that they are at least in the 9th grade or above. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Guest reservations are the responsibility of the debutante's family. Seating at the Cotillion Ball is by invitation per the list provided by the Debutante's family. The Debutante Presentation Fee includes five guests (which customarily consists of the Debutante, Escorts, Presenter and Mother).

The fee for each additional guest (beyond the five included in the Debutante fee) is \$150. Please make guest fee checks to Augusta Symphony Guild and mail to Karin Calloway, 878 Sturbridge Drive, Evans, GA 30809, by August 1st. Once you have paid for your reservations, there will be no refunds.

With the legal drinking age of 21, the Augusta Symphony Guild, Inc., has requested that parents be advised that we cannot condone violations of the law. The Marriott requires that proper identification be provided before serving **ANYONE** alcohol.

Individual pictures of the Debutantes and group pictures taken with <u>Deb, Escorts, Presenter and Mother</u> will be taken on the afternoon and evening of the ball. An appointment schedule will be assigned by lottery at the September 19 meeting. It is very important that those being photographed arrive on time so that you don't miss your photography session. While the photography sitting fee is included in the Cotillion Fee, the photography packages are optional expenses for each family. SHOULD YOU WISH TO HAVE ADDITIONAL FAMILY MEMBERS BEYOND THE FIVE (5) LISTED ABOVE IN YOUR PHOTOS, THE PHOTOGRAPHERS WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR GROUP PHOTOS DURING THE BALL.

Guidelines for Parties

The 2021 Debutante Season begins Wednesday, November 24, 2021, and ends Tuesday, November 22, 2022. All parties for the 2021 Debutantes are to be scheduled within this period of time.

The Party Coordinator, Kathy Schafer (706-533-4994, Kcs1121@comcast.net) is responsible for keeping a calendar of all social events during the season. To avoid any conflicts, please seek approval from Kathy before planning a party. The Coordinator should be given an up-to-date list of hostesses for each party and a current list of Debutantes to be honored at each party. Only Augusta Symphony Cotillion Debutantes should be honored.

The only information regarding parties that is to be released by the Party Coordinator will be the dates and times of the events.

The most well-attended parties are those given the weekend of Thanksgiving and those given during the Christmas holidays. Easter weekend and Masters Week are an option for parties, but mid-summers are not usually well-attended. Parties should be held at locations accessible to girls in the greater CSRA. It should be a reasonable expectation that a party date and location would allow most of the Debutantes to attend.

ALL Debutantes should be invited to ALL parties. ALL Debutantes must make every effort to attend all parties during the season.

Escorts are included in parties at the discretion of the hostesses. The invitation only extends to the names on the outer envelope of the invitation.

It is imperative that responses to invitations be prompt. When the Debutante is out of town, the girl's parent should respond to an invitation for their daughter. It is equally imperative that Thank You notes for all parties be written in a timely fashion.

Traditionally, those girls being honored at parties have taken a small gift or honorarium to each hostess of each party.

Instructions for Forms

ALL forms, with the exception of the Alcoholic Beverage Policy, are due by August 1.

We have included "example forms" in this notebook to help you prepare to fill out and email the forms when they are due.

All forms should be filled out in the Word document (available by email from Karin Calloway or on the Augusta Symphony Guild Website) and emailed to Karin.calloway@gmail.com.

THE ONLY EXCEPTION IS THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE POLICY FORMS. THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE FORMS INCLUDED IN THIS NOTEBOOK MUST BE FILLED OUT AND SIGNED BY THE DEBUTANTE AND THE TWO ESCORTS AND TURNED IN AT THE SEPTEMBER 19, 2021, MOTHER'S MEETING. Please keep copies of these forms for your records.

When filling out the forms, please provide full names and spell out all titles, middle names and suffixes (examples: Doctor, junior). For addresses, please spell out the numbers one to ten, the apartment numbers and the full name of the state.

- -The Program Information Form—This form is used to print the program for the Cotillion Presentation.
- -The Invitation Form for Debutante, Parents and Presenter—This form is used for the formal invitations that will be sent to these individuals.
- -The Invitation Form for Escorts—This form is used for the formal invitations that will be sent to these gentlemen.
- -The Invitation Form for Guests—This form is used for the formal invitations that will be sent to your invited guests.
- -The Seating Chart Form—This is for you to place your guests at tables and in the seats they will be sitting in.
- -The Presenter and Escort Information Form—This form is for information that is needed should we need to contact these individuals. (Note: Feel free to email this form to Karin.calloway@gmail.com as soon as it is completed.)
- -The Alcoholic Beverage Policy Forms—These forms must be signed by the Debutante and Escorts and should be brought to the meeting on September 19 or mailed to Karin Calloway, 878 Sturbridge Dr., Evans GA 30809.

AUGUSTA SYMPHONY GUILD COTILLION 2021 Appendix A

The Etiquette of Addressing Envelopes for Formal Occasions (you will be instructed on this again as your information is due to Caroline Yort for formal Cotillion Ball)

Use only a black fountain pen or a fine-point black rollerball pen.

Use a full and formal name. Do not use initials or abbreviations. Always include the correct social title, i.e., Mr./Mrs./Miss.

Spell out everything, i.e., Doctor/Number/Apartment/Post Office Box/Names of states (Georgia/District of Columbia)/Streets/Avenue and all numbers from One to Ninety-Nine. For hyphenated numbers, capitalize the first letter only. Spell out directional terms of North or Southeast.

A widow is always addressed as a Mrs. plus her late husband's name: Mrs. John Theodore Duncan.

A woman who is separate from her husband still goes by her married name.

A divorcee is Mrs. plus her maiden name and last name:
Mrs. Smith Johnson

In recent years, it has become permissible to use the first name also if so desired:

Mrs. Caroline Smith Johnson

There is no age limit on the use of Miss. A never-married woman is addressed as Miss all her life.

Ms. Is not used socially except in two instances:

- -If a divorcee has taken back her maiden name.
- -If a woman is married but has kept her maiden name.

A married woman does not use her professional title (Doctor, Judge, etc.) socially; rather, she should be addressed as Miss or Mrs. However, if it is known that she wishes to use her professional title anyway, an envelope would be addressed as follows:

Doctor Amy Keats Borden and Mr. William Rushton Borden

Lower case "and" must precede the husband's name on the second line to indicate they are married.

The inner envelope would read:

Doctor Borden and Mr. Borden

If the husband is also a medical doctor then Doctor would be used instead of Mr. on the outer envelope; and the inner envelope would read:

The Doctors Borden

Socially, Doctor should be used only for medical doctors, not for PhD's. If however, it is known that a man/woman would be offended if he/she were not addressed as Doctor, it is preferable not to offend.

A protestant minister is addressed as:

The Reverend Paul Howard Miles (Inner: The Reverend Miles)

If he is married, the names would read:

The Reverend and Mrs. Howard Miles

If he has his doctorate, the name would be written as:

The Reverend Doctor Paul Howard Miles (Inner: The Reverend Doctor Miles)

This is the exception to the PHD rule mentioned above.

Senior is not used unless the widow lives in the same town as her daughter-in-law and might be confused with her. Otherwise junior (or Jr.) separates their identities. A helpful reminder for this is that no one has "senior" on his birth certificate. When using "junior," spell it out using lower case "j" and put a comma between the last name and "junior." If space is limited, "junior" may be abbreviated and the "j" then capitalized.

When a name is followed by a Roman numeral (III, IV), it is preferable not to put a comma between the last name and the numeric suffix.

If a man holds or has held office granting addresses as The Honorable, Judge or Senator, he is formally addressed for life. If he (and his wife) is extending the invitation, he would not use The Honorable. That is bestowed by others and never used by the person to refer to himself.

For some elected or appointed officials:

Judge

Outer envelope: The Honorable and Mrs. John Philip Strong

Inner envelope: Judge and Mrs. Strong

United States Senator

Outer envelope: The honorable Franklin Moss Bush and Mrs. Bush

Inner envelope: Senator and Mrs. Bush

Governor

Outer envelope: The Governor and Mrs. Hill Inner envelope: The Governor and Mrs. Hill

The President of the United States

Outer envelope: The President and Mrs. Jones Inner envelope: The President and Mrs. Jones

Former President of the United States

Outer envelope: The Honorable James Walker and Mrs. Jones

Inner envelope: Mr. and Mrs. Jones

Do not use initials unless the initial does not stand for a name but is the name itself. If the full name cannot be found, then the initial should be omitted entirely.

If those extending the invitation wish for a single person to bring a guest of his or her choosing, then Miss Wilson and guest (lower case "g") would go in the inner envelope only. The outer envelope is reserved for the full name of the invitee (Ex.: Miss Alexandra Dexter Wilson)

If children under the age of 18 are invited along with their parents, the children's names appear only on the inner envelope beneath their parents' names and in age descending order as:

Mr. and Mrs. Clayton Coles, Henry and Meredith

The term "and family" is never used.

For children over the age of eighteen whose primary address is the same as that of their parents, the envelope would be addressed as follows:

Two daughters

Outer envelope: Miss Marth Louise

Miss Penelope Frances Walsh

OR

The Misses Walsh

Inner envelope: The Misses Walsh

Two sons

Outer envelope: Mr. Grant Williams

Mr. John Jerome Walsh

OR

The Messrs. Walsh

Inner envelope: The Messrs. Walsh

A daughter and a son

Outer envelope: Miss Martha Louise Walsh

Mr. Grant William Walsh

Inner envelope: Miss Walsh

Mr. Walsh

For all invitations, as well as social correspondence, the return address goes on the envelope flap, not the front upper left corner of the envelope. Only the address should be used; a name should not be included.

ADDRESSING ENVELOPES FOR CASUAL OCCASIONS

Social titles always precede name on the envelopes. The same rules for social titles for formal occasions apply to casual situations, expect that things like Doctor and junior name be abbreviated, i.e. Dr., and Jr. Please note that J is capitalized when junior is abbreviated.

The more familiar form of the name of the addressee may be used for casual situations, that is,

Mr. and Mrs. Jack Holobrook

Instead of the formal

Mr. and Mrs. John Henry Holbrook III

A few tips when completing the Cotillion Forms:

On all forms that you submit for addressing the formal Cotillion invitations, give the full names and address of each guest.

Use full names and formal titles. Do not abbreviate.

Do not use initials. Spell out all names.

Please spell out all titles, middle names and suffixes (examples: Doctor, junior)

Do not use symbols. Spell out the "and"

Spell out the state, the apartment numbers and the numbers ONE to TEN in addresses.

Write out the words Street, Boulevard, Avenue, etc.

Do not abbreviate state names.

AUGUSTA MARRIOTT AT THE CONVENTION CENTER ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE POLICY

The Augusta Marriott Hotel, as licensee, is responsible for the administration and service of alcoholic beverages in accordance with the law of the State of Georgia and the City of Augusta, which require that alcoholic beverages consumed on our licensed premises must be provided and served by the Hotel. The Hotel's alcoholic beverage service requires the Hotel to (1) request proper identification (photo ID) of any person of questionable age and refuse alcoholic beverage service if the person is either underage or proper identification cannot be produced and (2) refuse alcoholic beverage service to any person who, in the Hotel's judgment, appears intoxicated. To ensure these policies are followed, identification for those between 21 and 30 must be provided. Armbands indicating those of legal drinking age will be required for those requesting and possessing alcoholic beverages.

The recent changes in the Georgia law, relative to furnishing or selling of alcoholic beverages has prompted your society to express its concern to its members that we comply with such laws. The issue of abusive use of alcoholic beverages and driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs is indeed a serious issue.

It is our hope that by supplying you with this information, you may be better able to plan your social functions during the upcoming Debutante season.

The Georgia law on this subject is rather complex. We have been advised to suggest anyone planning to sponsor an event at which alcoholic beverages will be served should consult with their attorney beforehand.

For information purposes, you should be aware of the following facts: As of September 30, 1986, the State of Georgia requires that an individual be at least 21 years of age when purchasing or being furnished alcohol.

The Augusta Symphony Guild, Inc. sponsors only one event, the Cotillion. All other activities are privately held parties, which are hosted by you and/or your friends. The Augusta Symphony Guild, Inc. has no control over these privately held parties, and therefore cannot and does not assume any responsibility for them. At the Cotillion, alcoholic beverages will be served, but due to the legal requirements mandated by the drinking age law, identification for those between 21 and 30 must be provided. Armbands indicating those of legal drinking age will be required for those requesting and possessing alcoholic beverages. We ask you, your family and guests to respect this responsibility and not be offended should any of your children or their guests be asked to show identification. 
